



SEVEN THINGS CHRISTIANS MUST DO AFTER ELECTION DAY

Election Day is November 8, 2016. There are seven key things on which Christians must prayerfully concentrate starting the very next day:

1 HEAL RELATIONSHIPS

During this election season, many Christians have been discouraged by discord in the Body of Christ. The enemy has been working overtime to fester divisiveness, distracting Christians from being salt and light to a desperate culture. As Christians, we are called to pursue unity and show respect to our fellow brothers and sisters in Christ, no matter how intensely we disagree.

“Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity.”
– Colossians 3:13-14

2 REPENT

As Christians, we must personally repent of evil actions, words, or thoughts we have had this election cycle.

“Therefore bear fruit in keeping with repentance” – Matthew 3:8.
“Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord.” – Acts 3:19

3 FORGIVE

So many relationships have been torn apart during this election cycle. We must forgive our brothers and sisters in Christ, and we must ask for forgiveness for our harsh words, actions, and thoughts.

“For if you forgive others for their transgressions, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others, then your Father will not forgive your transgressions.” – Matthew 6:14-15

4 PRAY FOR AND HONOR ELECTED OFFICIALS

We are commanded by Scripture to pray for our elected officials.

“First of all, then, I urge that entreaties and prayers, petitions and thanksgivings, be made on behalf of all men, for kings and all who are in authority, so that we may lead a tranquil and quiet life in all godliness and dignity.” – 1 Timothy 2:1-2

We are also commanded by Scripture to respect our elected officials, no matter what party they belong to or what ideology they have.

“Honor all people, love the brotherhood, fear God, honor the king.”
– 1 Peter 2:17

5 ENGAGE THE CHURCH

When God’s institutions of the church and government work together appropriately, God is glorified and the people are blessed. Post-election is a great time for the church to be the church!

- Government is an institution of the Lord’s, designed to punish those who do evil and reward those who do good (Romans 13, 1 Peter 2). Yet governments cannot rightly determine good and evil without the church of Jesus Christ.
- The law, furthermore, is designed as a moral guide and teacher to the people. All the more reason the church’s voice is needed in government.
- When government operates God’s way, it should point people to Christ rather than farther away. King Hezekiah, King Josiah, and the repentance of the king of Nineveh are excellent examples.
- The church can be a prophetic voice to our leaders, like Nathan to David.

“Submit yourselves for the Lord’s sake to every human authority: ... to governors, who are sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right.” – 1 Peter 2:13-14

6 STAY INFORMED AND ENGAGED

After an election cycle like 2016, it would be understandable if Christians felt like saying, “I’m done!” To the contrary, God wants us to stand firm, be grounded in righteousness and His Word, never give up, be the light in the darkness, stay engaged, and be informed.
